### Summary (as of May 11, 2023)

#### Mudslide Recovery Act

This bill requires the Department of the Interior and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to jointly establish a pilot program to make grants to eligible recipients to implement innovative solutions to repair damage caused by mudslides that occur after a wildland fire.

An eligible recipient is (1) a state, an Indian tribe, or a forestry agency of a state or tribe; (2) a local government; (3) a fire department; and (4) a nonprofit organization.

## Actions Timeline

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- **May 12, 2023:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Economic Development, Public Buildings, and Emergency Management.
- **May 11, 2023:** Introduced in House
- **May 11, 2023:** Referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and in addition to the Committee on Natural Resources, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
