Summary (as of Jan 18, 2024)

Social Security Child Protection Act of 2023

This bill directs the Social Security Administration to issue a new Social Security number to a child under the age of 14 if the child's Social Security card was lost or stolen while being sent.

- **Jan 18, 2024:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Jan 16, 2024:** Mr. Smith (NE) moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill, as amended.
- **Jan 16, 2024:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H139-141)
- **Jan 16, 2024:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 3667.
- **Jan 16, 2024:** At the conclusion of debate, the chair put the question on the motion to suspend the rules. Mr. Smith (NE) objected to the vote on the grounds that a quorum was not present. Further proceedings on the motion were postponed. The point of no quorum was considered as withdrawn.
