- **May 10, 2023:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 118-51, by Mr. Roy.
- **May 10, 2023:** The resolution provides for consideration of H.R. 2 under a closed rule with five hours of general debate, and the resolution provides for consideration of H.R. 1163 under a closed rule with one hour of general debate. The resolution provides for a motion to recommit on each measure.
- **May 10, 2023:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 16.
- **May 10, 2023:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H2184-2194; text: CR H2184)
- **May 10, 2023:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 383.
- **May 10, 2023:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - The Chair put the question on agreeing to H. Res. 383 and by voice vote, announced that the ayes had prevailed. Ms. Scanlon demanded a recorded vote and the Chair postponed further proceedings until a time to be announced.
- **May 10, 2023:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H2194-2195)
- **May 10, 2023:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution, as amended Agreed to by recorded vote: 215 - 209 (Roll no. 207).
