This resolution sets forth the rule for consideration of

- the bill (H.R. 467) to amend the Controlled Substances Act with respect to the scheduling of fentanyl-related substances,
- the joint resolution (S.J. Res. 11) providing for congressional disapproval of the rule submitted by the Environmental Protection Agency titled *Control of Air Pollution From New Motor Vehicles: Heavy-Duty Engine and Vehicle Standards*, and
- the joint resolution (H.J. Res. 45) providing for congressional disapproval of the rule submitted by the Department of Education relating to waivers and modifications of federal student loans.

Actions Timeline

- **May 23, 2023:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H2512-2522)
- **May 23, 2023:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 429.
- **May 23, 2023:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H. Res. 429, the Chair put the question on ordering the previous question, and by voice vote announced the ayes had prevailed. Ms. Leger Fernandez demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceedings until a time to be announced.
- **May 23, 2023:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H2522-2523)
- **May 23, 2023:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 219 - 208 (Roll no. 230).
- **May 23, 2023:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by recorded vote: 217 - 204 (Roll no. 231). (text: CR H2512)

- **May 22, 2023:** Introduced in House
- **May 22, 2023:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 118-76, by Mr. Burgess.
- **May 22, 2023:** The resolution provides for consideration of H.R. 467 under a structured rule with one hour of general debate. S.J. Res. 11 and H.J. Res. 45 are considered under closed rules with one hour of general debate. Motion to recommit provided on H.R. 467 and H.J. Res. 45, and one motion to commit on S.J. Res. 11.
- **May 22, 2023:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 20.
