Summary (as of Jun 27, 2023)

PHE Congressional Review Act

This bill requires Congress to regularly review whether to continue or end a declared public health emergency.

Specifically, each chamber of Congress must meet within six months of a declaration of a national public health emergency, and every six months thereafter until the emergency ends, to consider a vote on a joint resolution as to whether to end the emergency.

- **Jul 7, 2023:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Jun 27, 2023:** Introduced in House
- **Jun 27, 2023:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Rules, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
