Wireless Electric Vehicle Charging Grant Program Act of 2023

This bill requires the Department of Transportation to establish a program that awards grants for projects to construct, install, or improve existing wireless charging infrastructure and technology for electric vehicles, including performance, safety, electromagnetic compatibility, interoperability, development, and testing of wireless charging. State and local governments, metropolitan planning organizations, transit agencies, and other eligible entities may apply for the grants.

Actions Timeline

- **Jul 14, 2023:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Highways and Transit.
- **Jul 13, 2023:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 13, 2023:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
