Summary (as of Jul 25, 2023)

Clinical Laboratory Price Transparency Act of 2023

This bill requires providers of certain laboratory services under Medicare to publish their prices online.

Specifically, providers must publish and update at least annually the discounted cash price or gross charge (as applicable) for their services and, if required by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS), the minimum and maximum negotiated rates between the provider and insurers. The bill applies to clinical diagnostic laboratory tests that are included in the list of shoppable services in CMS regulations, excluding advanced diagnostic laboratory tests. Providers that fail to comply with these requirements may be subject to civil penalties.

Actions Timeline

- **Dec 17, 2024:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Jul 28, 2023:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Jul 25, 2023:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 25, 2023:** Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means, and in addition to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
