Summary (as of Jun 21, 2023)

This concurrent resolution calls on the President to sign the [Secure the Border Act of 2023](#) if it passes the Senate.

(The Secure the Border Act of 2023 makes various changes to immigration law, including by imposing limits on asylum eligibility and requiring employers to use an electronic system to verify the employment eligibility of new employees. At the time this concurrent resolution was introduced, that bill had passed the House of Representatives but not the Senate.)

Actions Timeline

- **Jun 21, 2023:** Introduced in House
- **Jun 21, 2023:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committees on Homeland Security, Ways and Means, Education and the Workforce, and Foreign Affairs, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **Jun 21, 2023:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Border Security and Enforcement.
