### Summary (as of Apr 18, 2023)

This joint resolution proposes a constitutional amendment regarding the election of Senators.

Specifically, the joint resolution (1) specifies that no person shall be a Senator from a state unless such person has been elected by the people of that state, and (2) requires the executive authority of a state to issue a writ of election to fill any vacancy in a state's representation in the Senate.
