### **Actions Timeline**

- **Jul 26, 2023:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 26, 2023:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 118-158, by Mr. Reschenthaler.
- **Jul 26, 2023:** The resolution provides for consideration of H.R. 4366, under a structured rule with one hour of general debate and a motion to recommit. The resolution provides for consideration of S.J. Res. 9 and S.J. Res. 24, under a closed rule with one hour of general debate for both joint resolutions and one motion to commit for both joint resolutions.
- **Jul 26, 2023:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 31.
- **Jul 26, 2023:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H3966-3974; text: CR H3966-3967)
- **Jul 26, 2023:** UNANIMOUS CONSENT REQUEST - Mr. Reschenthaler asked unanimous consent that the resolution be amended by striking the last sentence in the first section of H. Res. 614 and inserting "All points of order against provisions in the bill are waived.". Agreed to without objection.
- **Jul 26, 2023:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 614.
- **Jul 26, 2023:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H.Res. 614, the Chair put the question on ordering the previous question to H.Res. 614 and by voice vote announced that the yeas had prevailed. Mr. Neguse demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceedings until a time to be announced.
- **Jul 26, 2023:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H3974-3976)
- **Jul 26, 2023:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 208 - 191 (Roll no. 367).
- **Jul 26, 2023:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution, as amended Agreed to by recorded vote: 217 - 206 (Roll no. 368).
- **Jul 26, 2023:** On agreeing to the resolution, as amended Agreed to by recorded vote: 217 - 206 (Roll no. 368).
