Tax Stamp Revenue Transfer for Wildlife and Recreation Act

This bill transfers a portion of the excise tax for transferring a firearms suppressor and allocates tax revenues to support wildlife conservation and recreational activities, and expedite the processing of suppressor applications by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives.

Actions Timeline

- **Sep 10, 2024:** Subcommittee Hearings Held
- **Sep 9, 2024:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Water, Wildlife, and Fisheries.
- **Nov 9, 2023:** Introduced in House
- **Nov 9, 2023:** Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means, and in addition to the Committees on the Judiciary, and Natural Resources, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
