### Summary (as of Dec 6, 2023)

### No Taxpayer Funding for Ivy League Schools Act

This bill prohibits federal funding for any institution of higher education (IHE) that has an endowment of \$5 billion or more. However, such an IHE may receive federal funds for projects or research related to a national critical function. *National critical function* means a function of government that is so vital to the United States that its disruption would endanger national security or operational control of the southern border.
