- **Sep 19, 2023:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 680.
- **Sep 19, 2023:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H. Res. 680, the Chair put the question on ordering the previous question and by voice vote announced that the ayes had prevailed. Ms. Leger Fernandez demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceedings until a time to be announced.
- **Sep 19, 2023:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H4403-4404)
- **Sep 19, 2023:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 217 - 209 (Roll no. 397).
- **Sep 19, 2023:** Failed of passage/not agreed to in House On agreeing to the resolution Failed by recorded vote: 212 - 214 (Roll no. 398).
- **Sep 19, 2023:** On agreeing to the resolution Failed by recorded vote: 212 - 214 (Roll no. 398).

- **Sep 13, 2023:** Introduced in House
- **Sep 13, 2023:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 118-193, by Mr. Cole.
- **Sep 13, 2023:** The resolution provides for consideration of H.R. 1435 under a closed rule and H.R. 4365 under a structured rule. The rule provides for one hour of general debate on each measure with one motion to recommit allowed.
