Fiscal State of the Nation Act

This bill requires the House of Representatives and the Senate to conduct an annual joint meeting to receive a presentation from the Comptroller General regarding (1) the Government Accountability Office's audit of the financial statement of the executive branch, and (2) the financial position and condition of the federal government. The bill also requires concurrent resolutions on the budget to include a statement of findings informed by the presentation.

- **Jan 11, 2024:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 11, 2024:** Referred to the Committee on House Administration, and in addition to the Committees on Rules, and the Budget, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.

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
