Summary (as of Feb 7, 2024)

Comprehensive National Mercury Monitoring Act

This bill requires the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to establish a national mercury monitoring program. Under the program, the EPA must track and report on long-term changes of mercury concentrations in air, water, soil, and fish and wildlife. In addition, the EPA must establish an online database for mercury data.

Actions Timeline

- **Feb 9, 2024:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Environment, Manufacturing, and Critical Materials.
- **Feb 8, 2024:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Water Resources and Environment.
- **Feb 7, 2024:** Introduced in House
- **Feb 7, 2024:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
