Stop Communist Construction of Public Infrastructure Act or the Stop CCP Infrastructure Act

This bill prohibits certain entities related to China or the Chinese government from receiving federal funds for public works projects in the United States.

Specifically, this prohibition applies to entities that are (1) headquartered in China; or (2) owned, financed, influenced by, or affiliated with the Chinese government, the Chinese Communist Party (CCP), or the Chinese military. Further, state and local governments must verify that a recipient of federal funds for a public works project is free from any obligations, influences, or connections to any of these entities.

- **Feb 3, 2023:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Economic Development, Public Buildings, and Emergency Management.
- **Feb 2, 2023:** Introduced in House
- **Feb 2, 2023:** Referred to the House Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.
