(Mann Gulch is located in the Helena-Lewis and Clark National Forest in Montana.) The resolution proclaims that August 5, 2024, be designated as Mann Gulch Memorial Tribute Day.

The resolution also expresses appreciation to all of the men and women who currently fight wildfires across the United States.
