This concurrent resolution resolves that

- the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act does not prohibit elementary or secondary school students from discussing or sharing information about non-dairy milk alternatives with their classmates;
- parents and students should be provided with as much information as possible about school meal nutrition; and
- parents and students, in consultation with their physicians, should have as much choice as possible in the school lunch program.
