Ukraine Security Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2024

This bill provides FY2024 supplemental appropriations for federal departments and agencies to respond to the conflict in Ukraine. The bill designates the funding as emergency spending, which is exempt from discretionary spending limits.

Specifically, the bill provides appropriations to the

- Department of Defense (DOD),
- Department of Energy science programs,
- the National Nuclear Security Administration,
- the Administration for Children and Families,
- the Department of State, and
- the U.S. Agency for International Development.

The funding is provided for purposes such as

- supporting current U.S. military operations in the region,
- the Ukraine Security Assistance Initiative,
- replacing defense articles that were provided to Ukraine,
- reimbursing DOD for defense services and training provided to Ukraine,
- the Foreign Military Financing Program,
- economic support for Ukraine,
- refugee and entrant assistance,
- international narcotics control and law enforcement, and
- the development and production of isotopes.

The bill also includes provisions that

- expand the authorities of the President to transfer defense articles and services from DOD to foreign countries or international organizations,
- require the President to transfer long-range Army Tactical Missile Systems to Ukraine,
- require the President to enter into an agreement with Ukraine regarding repaying the United States for the economic assistance it has provided to Ukraine,
- require certain funds that are provided for Ukraine to be matched by other donors, and
- establish various oversight and reporting requirements for assistance provided to Ukraine.

Actions Timeline

- **Apr 23, 2024:** Pursuant to the provisions of H. Res. 1160, H.R. 8035 is laid on the table.
- **Apr 20, 2024:** Considered under the provisions of rule H. Res. 1160. (consideration: CR H2594-2607; text: CR H2598-2603)
- **Apr 20, 2024:** Rule provides for consideration of H.R. 8034, H.R. 8035, H.R. 8036 and H.R. 8038. The resolution provides for consideration of H.R. 8034 under a closed rule and H.R. 8035, H.R. 8036, and H.R. 8038 under a structured rule. Provides for 30 minutes of general debate and one motion recommit on each bill. Rule also provides that upon disposition of the bills under consideration, the House will be considered to have taken from the Speaker's table H.R. 815 and to have concurred in the Senate amendment with an amendment inserting the texts of all bills as passed by the House, if passed.
- **Apr 20, 2024:** House resolved itself into the Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union pursuant to H. Res. 1160 and Rule XVIII.
- **Apr 20, 2024:** The Speaker designated the Honorable Virginia Foxx to act as Chairwoman of the Committee.
- **Apr 20, 2024:** GENERAL DEBATE - The Committee of the Whole proceeded with 30 minutes of general debate on H.R. 8035.
- **Apr 20, 2024:** DEBATE - Pursuant to the provisions of H. Res. 1160, the Committee of the Whole proceeded with 10 minutes of debate on the Spartz amendment No. 1.
- **Apr 20, 2024:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on the Spartz amendment No. 1, the Chair put the question on agreeing to the amendment and by voice vote, announced the noes had prevailed. Mrs. Spartz demanded a recorded vote, and the Chair postponed further proceedings until a time to be announced.

- **Apr 20, 2024:** On motion to recommit Failed by recorded vote: 88 - 336 (Roll no. 150).
- **Apr 20, 2024:** Passed/agreed to in House: On passage Passed by the Yeas and Nays: 311 - 112, 1 Present (Roll no. 151).
