Protecting Consumers from PFAS Act

This bill adds the Consumer Product Safety Commission to the interagency working group to coordinate federal activities related to research about perfluoroalkyl or polyfluoroalkyl substances, commonly referred to as PFAS.

No additional funds are authorized to be appropriated to carry out the bill.

- **Nov 27, 2023:** Placed on Senate Legislative Calendar under General Orders. Calendar No. 250.
- **Jun 14, 2023:** Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs. Ordered to be reported with an amendment favorably.
- **Mar 15, 2023:** Introduced in Senate
- **Mar 15, 2023:** Read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs.
