- **Nov 2, 2023:** The resolution provides for consideration of H.R. 4821 and H.R. 4820 under a structured rule with one hour of general debate for each bill. The resolution provides for consideration of H.R. 6126, under a closed rule, with one hour of general debate. Each measure has one motion to recommit.
- **Nov 2, 2023:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 46.
- **Nov 2, 2023:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H5235-5241)
- **Nov 2, 2023:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 838.
- **Nov 2, 2023:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H. Res. 838, the Chair put the question on ordering the previous question and by voice vote announced that the ayes had prevailed. Mr. McGovern demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceedings until a time to be announced.

- **Nov 2, 2023:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 213 - 200 (Roll no. 565).
