Summary (as of Feb 6, 2024)

This resolution sets forth the rule for consideration of the resolution (H.Res. 863) impeaching Alejandro Nicholas Mayorkas, Secretary of Homeland Security, for high crimes and misdemeanors.

Further, it provides for consideration of the bill (H.R. 485) to amend title XI of the Social Security Act to prohibit the use of quality-adjusted life years and similar measures in coverage and payment determinations under federal health care programs.

Actions Timeline

- **Feb 6, 2024:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H437-447)
- **Feb 6, 2024:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 996.
- **Feb 6, 2024:** At the conclusion of debate on H. Res. 996, the Chair put the question on ordering the previous question and by voice vote announced that the ayes had prevailed. Mr. McGovern demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceedings until a time to be announced.
- **Feb 6, 2024:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H447-449)
- **Feb 6, 2024:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 215 - 207 (Roll no. 34). (consideration: CR H447-448)
- **Feb 6, 2024:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by recorded vote: 216 - 209 (Roll no. 35). (text: CR H437)
- **Feb 6, 2024:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by recorded vote: 216 - 209 (Roll no. 35). (text: CR H437)
- **Feb 6, 2024:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Feb 5, 2024:** Introduced in House
- **Feb 5, 2024:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 118-374, by Mr. Burgess.
- **Feb 5, 2024:** The resolution provides for consideration of H. Res. 863 under a closed rule and H.R. 485 under a structured rule. The rule provides for two hours of general debate on H. Res. 863 and one hour of general debate on H.R. 485. One motion to recommit allowed on H.R. 485. The resolution further provides that upon adoption H. Res. 863, H. Res. 995 is hereby adopted; and further, that no other resolution incidental to impeachment relating to H. Res. 863 shall be privileged during the remainder of the 118th Congress.
- **Feb 5, 2024:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 62.
