Summary (as of Mar 26, 2026)

This resolution provides for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 5408) to accelerate workplace time-to-contract under the National Labor Relations Act.

Actions Timeline

- **Jun 9, 2026:** NOTIFICATION OF INTENT TO OFFER MOTION TO DISCHARGE - Mr. Norcross notified the House of his intent to offer a motion to discharge the Committee on Rules from further consideration of H. Res. 1140 pursuant to clause 2(c) of rule XV.
- **Jun 9, 2026:** MOTION TO DISCHARGE COMMITTEE - Pursuant to clause 2 of rule XV, Mr. Norcross called up motion No. 7, to discharge the Committee on Rules from further consideration of H. Res. 1140.
- **Jun 9, 2026:** DEBATE - Pursuant to the rule, the House proceeded with 20 minutes of debate on the Norcross motion to discharge.
- **Jun 9, 2026:** Mr. Norcross moved to discharge.
- **Jun 9, 2026:** On motion to discharge Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 220 - 199 (Roll no. 212).
- **Jun 9, 2026:** Consideration initiated from the Discharge Calendar.
- **Jun 9, 2026:** Considered from the Discharge Calendar. (consideration: CR H4013-4017)
- **Jun 9, 2026:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 1140.
