Summary (as of May 12, 2026)

This resolution eliminates a requirement to include the text of H.R. 1346, the Nationwide Consumer and Fuel Retailer Choice Act of 2025, as passed by the House of Representatives, in H.R. 7567, the Farm, Food, and National Security Act of 2026 (commonly known as the farm bill). The requirement is contained in H.Res. 1224, which also provides for the consideration of both H.R. 7567 and H.R. 1346. (H.Res. 1224 was agreed to in the House on April 29, 2026.)

Actions Timeline

- **May 13, 2026:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H3410-3417)
- **May 13, 2026:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 1274.
- **May 13, 2026:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H. Res. 1274, the Chair put the question on ordering the previous question and by voice vote, announced the ayes had prevailed. Mr. McGovern demanded the yeas and nays and Chair postponed further proceedings until a time to be announced.
- **May 13, 2026:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H3419-3420)
- **May 13, 2026:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 211 - 206 (Roll no. 160).
