The Chair directed the Clerk to report the resolution. Upon examination of the resolution, the Chair determined that the resolution did constitute a question of the privileges of the House.

- **Jun 30, 2026:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 1399.
- **Jun 30, 2026:** The previous question was ordered without objection.
- **Jun 30, 2026:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H. Res. 1399, the Chair put the question on agreeing to the resolution and by voice vote, announced the ayes had prevailed. Mr. Massie demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceedings until a time to be announced.
