Commission to Relocate the Federal Bureaucracy Act

This bill establishes a commission to study the relocation of nonsecurity-related federal agencies based in the Washington, DC, metropolitan area to other areas throughout the United States. Within one year of the bill's enactment the commission must submit a report to Congress that includes relocation recommendations based on specified considerations.

Actions Timeline

- **Jan 3, 2025:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 3, 2025:** Referred to the House Committee on Oversight and Government Reform.
