### Summary (as of Jan 13, 2025)

#### Disabled Veterans Tax Termination Act

This bill modifies provisions related to military retired pay. Specifically, the bill authorizes veterans with a service-connected disability of less than 50% to concurrently receive both retired pay and disability compensation. The bill also makes qualified disability retirees with less than 20 years of retirement-creditable service eligible for concurrent receipt, subject to specified reductions in retired pay.

## **Actions Timeline**

---

- **Feb 11, 2025:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Disability Assistance and Memorial Affairs.
- **Jan 13, 2025:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 13, 2025:** Referred to the Committee on Armed Services, and in addition to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
