A Representative from Maryland. Born in Huntington, Suffolk County, N. Y. , November 21, 1961. Graduated from Huntington High School, Huntington, N. Y. , 1979. Attended United States Military Academy, West Point, N. Y. A. B. , Harvard University, Cambridge, Mass. , 1984. J. D. , Harvard University, Cambridge, Mass. , 1992. United States Army, 1984-1989. United States Army Reserve, 1989-2014. Lawyer, private practice. Member of the Maryland state general assembly, 1999-2007, majority whip, 2004-2007. Lieutenant governor of Maryland, 2007-2015. Unsuccessful candidate for Governor of Maryland in 2014. Elected as a Democrat to the One Hundred Fifteenth and to the two succeeding Congresses (January 3, 2017-January 3, 2023). Was not a candidate for reelection to the One Hundred Eighteenth Congress in 2022. Attorney general of Maryland, 2023-present.
