A Representative and a Senator from North Carolina. Born in Davie County, N. C. , October 21, 1971. Graduated from Davie County High School, Mocksville, N. C. , 1990. B. S. , Appalachian State University, Boone, N. C. , 1994. M. A. , Dallas Theological Seminary, Dallas, Tex. , 1998. M. B. A. , Wake Forest University, Winston-Salem, N. C. , 2007. Business owner. Elected as a Republican to the One Hundred Fifteenth and to the two succeeding Congresses (January 3, 2017-January 3, 2023). Was not a candidate for reelection to the House of Representatives but was elected as a Republican to the United States Senate in 2022 for the term ending January 3, 2029.
