## **Biography**

A Representative from Missouri. Born in Kansas City, Jackson County, Mo., May 29, 1943. Attended public schools. B. A., William Jewell College, Liberty, Mo., 1965. M. P. A., New York University, New York, N. Y., 1969. J. D., Washington University, St. Louis, Mo., 1969. Admitted to the Missouri bar in 1969 and commenced practice in Kansas City. Served as State assistant attorney general, 1969-1972. Elected to the State house of representatives, 1973-1976. Elected simultaneously as a Republican to the Ninety-fourth and Ninety-fifth Congress by special election to fill the vacancy caused by the death of United States Representative Jerry L. Litton, and reelected to the seven succeeding Congresses (November 2, 1976-January 3, 1993). Unsuccessful candidate for reelection in 1992 to the One Hundred Third Congress. Is a resident of Fairfax County, Va.
