Assistant county manager, Clark County, Nev. Chief of staff to Nevada governor Bob Miller. Federal prosecutor. Attorney general of Nevada 2007-2015. Executive vice chancellor for the Nevada System of Higher Education. Elected as a Democrat to the United States Senate in 2016. Re-elected in 2022 for the term ending January 3, 2029. Chair, Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee (2019-2021).
