Elected as a Democrat to the One Hundred Eleventh Congress, by special election, to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of United States Representative Robert Wexler, and reelected to the six succeeding Congresses until his resignation on September 30, 2022 (April 13, 2010–September 30, 2022). Chair, Committee on Ethics (One Hundred Sixteenth and One Hundred Seventeenth Congresses).
