A Senator from Colorado. Born in Narbeth, Penn. , February 7, 1952. Graduated The Haverford School, Haverford, Penn. , 1970. B. A. , English, Wesleyan University, 1974. M. S. , geology, Wesleyan University, 1980. Geologist. Brewpub owner. Mayor of Denver 2003-2011. Governor of Colorado 2011-2019. Was an unsuccessful candidate for the Democratic presidential nomination in 2020. Elected as a Democrat to the United States Senate in 2020 for the term ending January 3, 2027.
