A Senator from North Dakota. Born in Bismarck, N. D. , March 13, 1957. Graduated Dartmouth College, B. A. , 1979. Graduated Northwestern University, M. B. A. , 1981. Bank president and CEO. Governor of North Dakota 2000-2010. Elected as a Republican to the United States Senate in 2010. Reelected in 2016, and again in 2022 for the term ending January 3, 2029. Chair, Committee on Indian Affairs (One Hundred Fifteenth and One Hundred Sixteenth Congresses).
