A Senator from New Hampshire. Born in Boston, Mass. , February 27, 1958. B. A. , Brown University, Providence, R. I. , 1980. J. D. , Northeastern University School of Law, Boston, Mass. , 1985. Attorney. Member of the New Hampshire Advisory Committee to the Adequacy in Education and Finance Commission. Member of the New Hampshire state senate 2004-2010, serving as majority leader 2008-2010. Governor of New Hampshire 2013-2016. Elected as a Democrat to the United States Senate in 2016. Reelected in 2022 for the term ending January 3, 2029.
