A Representative from South Carolina. Born in Savannah, Chatham County, Ga. , October 11, 1959. Graduated from May River Academy, Bluffton, S. C. B. A. , Duke University, Durham, N. C. , 1981. J. D. , University of Virginia, Charlottesville, Va. , 1984. Lawyer, private practice. Greenville County Republican Party, executive committee. Elected as a Republican to the One Hundred Third and to the two succeeding Congresses (January 3, 1993-January 3, 1999). Was not a candidate in 1998 for reelection to the U. S. House of Representatives but was an unsuccessful candidate for election to the United States Senate. Elected as a Republican to the One Hundred Ninth and to the two succeeding Congresses (January 3, 2005-January 3, 2011). Unsuccessful candidate for nomination for One Hundred Twelfth Congress in 2010.
