A Senator from Maine. Born in Alexandria, Va. , March 31, 1944. Graduated Dartmouth College, B. A. , 1966. Graduated University of Virginia, J. D. , 1969. Lawyer. Counsel, U. S. Senate Subcommittee on Alcoholism and Narcotics. Television program host and co-producer. Company executive. Energy conservation company owner. Governor of Maine 1995-2003. Elected as an Independent to the United States Senate in 2012 for the term commencing January 3, 2013. Reelected in 2018 and again in 2024 for the term ending January 3, 2031.
