Member, Ashland City Council, 1972-1976. Business owner. Rancher. Real estate agent. Elected as a Republican to the One Hundred Fifth and two succeeding Congresses (January 3, 1997-January 3, 2003). Was not a candidate for reelection to the One Hundred Eighth Congress in 2002. Governor of Alabama, 2003-2011.
