A Senator and a Representative from Nevada. Born in Chicago, Cook County, Ill. , August 2, 1957. B. A. , University of Minnesota, Minneapolis, Minn. , 1979. Computer software developer. Business owner. Elected as a Democrat to the One Hundred Fifteenth Congress (January 3, 2017-January 3, 2019). Was not a candidate for reelection to the House of Representatives but was elected as a Democrat to the United States Senate in 2018. Reelected in 2024 for the term ending January 3, 2031.
