A Senator from North Carolina. Born in Jacksonville, Duval County, Fla. , August 30, 1960. B. A. , University of Maryland University College, 1997. Management consultant. Member of the Cornelius (N. C.) board of commissioners 2003-2005. Member of the North Carolina house of representatives 2007-2014, serving as speaker of the house 2011-2014. Elected as a Republican to the United States Senate in 2014. Reelected in 2020 for the term ending January 3, 2027.
