### Biography

A Representative from Ohio. Born in Norwich, Muskingum County, Ohio, November 23, 1920. Attended Pataskala public schools, Otterbein College, and Ohio State University. J. D. , Harvard Law School, 1948. Enlisted in United States Army as a private, attained rank of first lieutenant and served with Thirtieth Infantry Division in Europe during the Second World War, participated in the Normandy invasion. Lieutenant colonel in Army Reserves. Assistant attorney general of Ohio, 1951-1954. Assistant city attorney of Columbus, Ohio, 1949-1950. Elected city attorney of Columbus, Ohio, 1953-1956. Administrator of Bureau of Workman's Compensation for the State of Ohio in 1957. Appointed first assistant to the Governor of Ohio in 1957. Elected president of Ohio Municipal League in 1957. Practicing attorney, 1959-1968. Served three terms in State Legislature of Ohio, 1961-1967. Elected as a Republican to the Ninetieth and to the twelve succeeding Congresses (January 3, 1967-January 3, 1993). Was not a candidate for renomination in 1992 to the One Hundred Third Congress. Practiced law in Columbus until his death there on August 14, 1998. Interment in Saint Joseph Cemetery, Lockburne, Ohio.
