Lawyer, private practice. Unsuccessful candidate for election to the One Hundred Eleventh Congress in 2008. Member of the New York state senate, 2011-2014. Elected as a Republican to the One Hundred Fourteenth and to the three succeeding Congresses (January 3, 2015-January 3, 2023). Was not a candidate for reelection to the One Hundred Eighteenth Congress in 2022, but was an unsuccessful candidate for Governor of New York. Administrator, Environmental Protection Agency, 2025-present.
